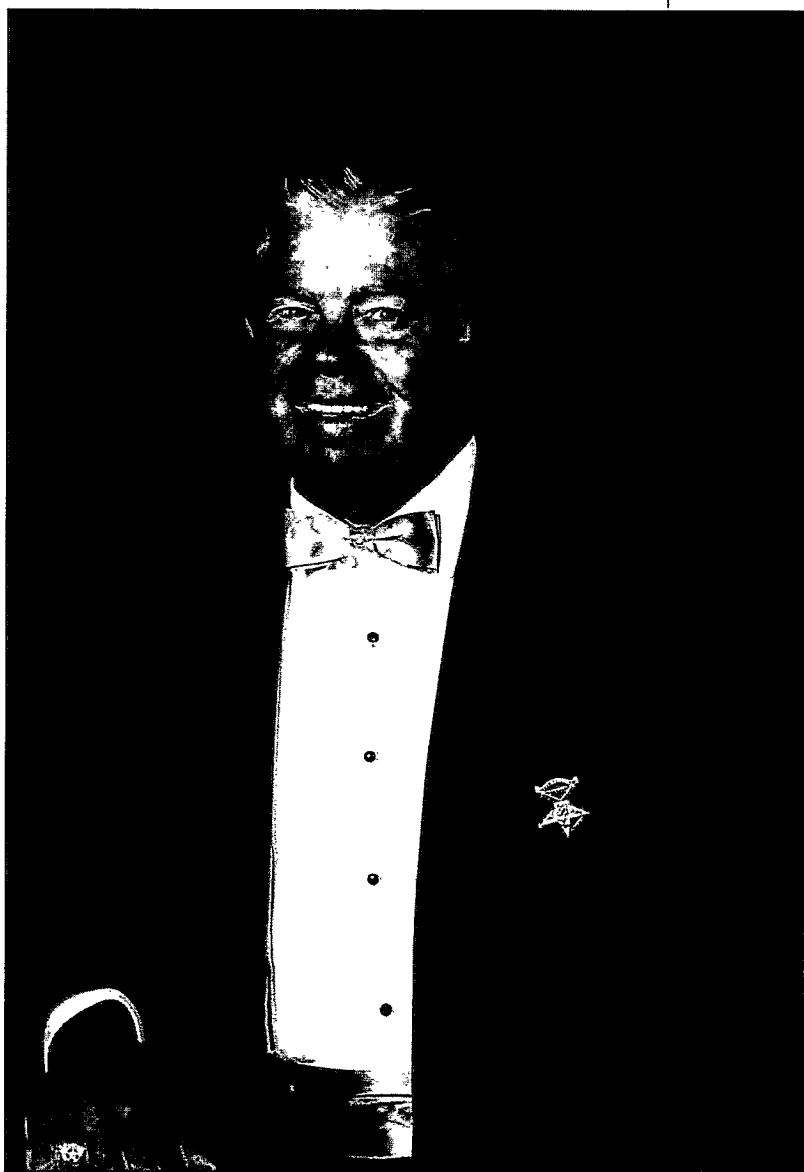

He was elected Grand Sentinel for the years 1992-93 and Associate Grand Patron in 1993-94.

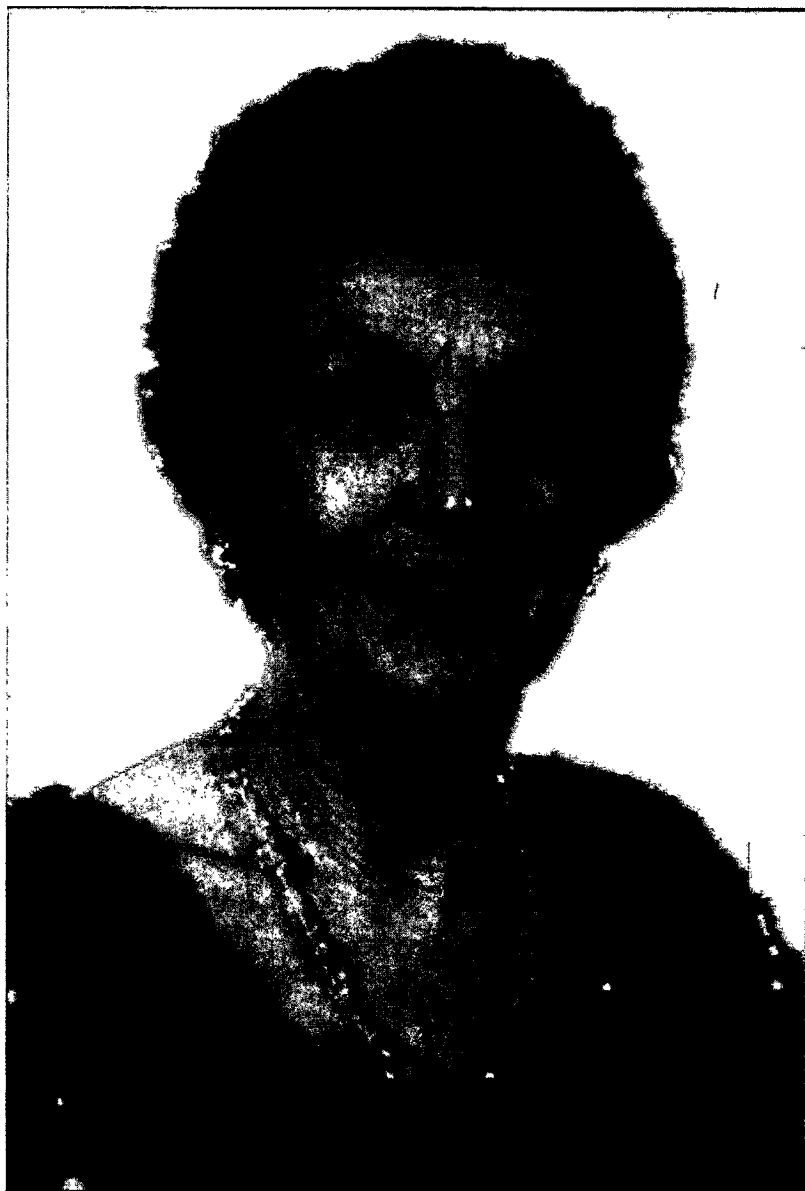
He was elected as Worthy Grand Patron of the State of South Carolina in June of 1994, and served through June 1995.

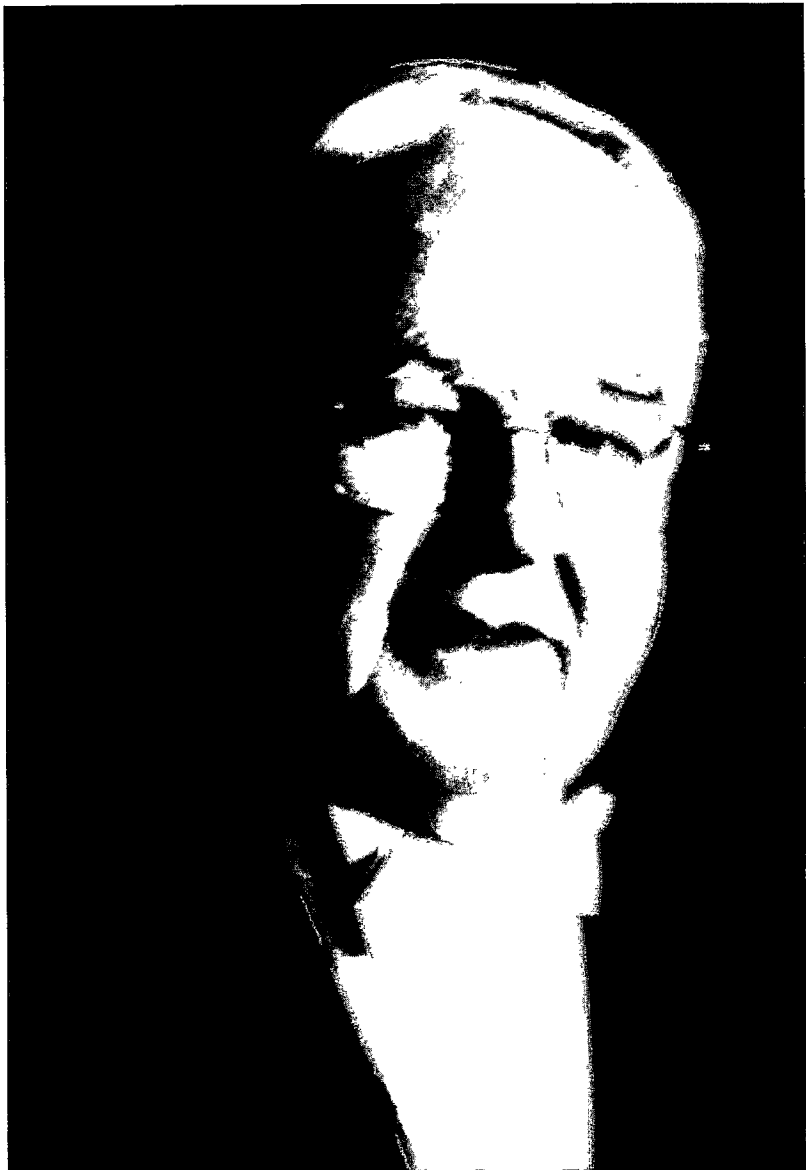
Glen was married to Alice Honea in 1985, and she is a constant travel companion in his Eastern Star journey.

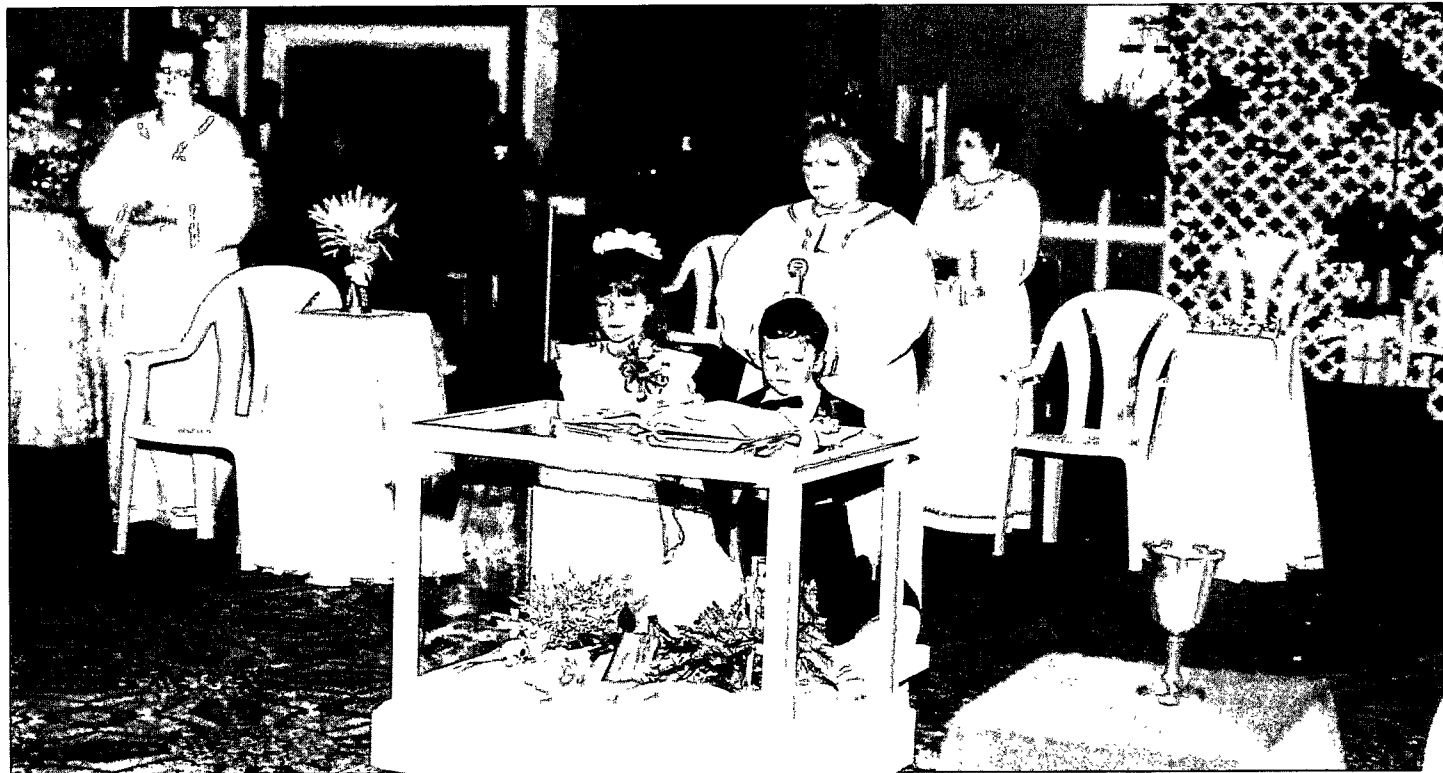

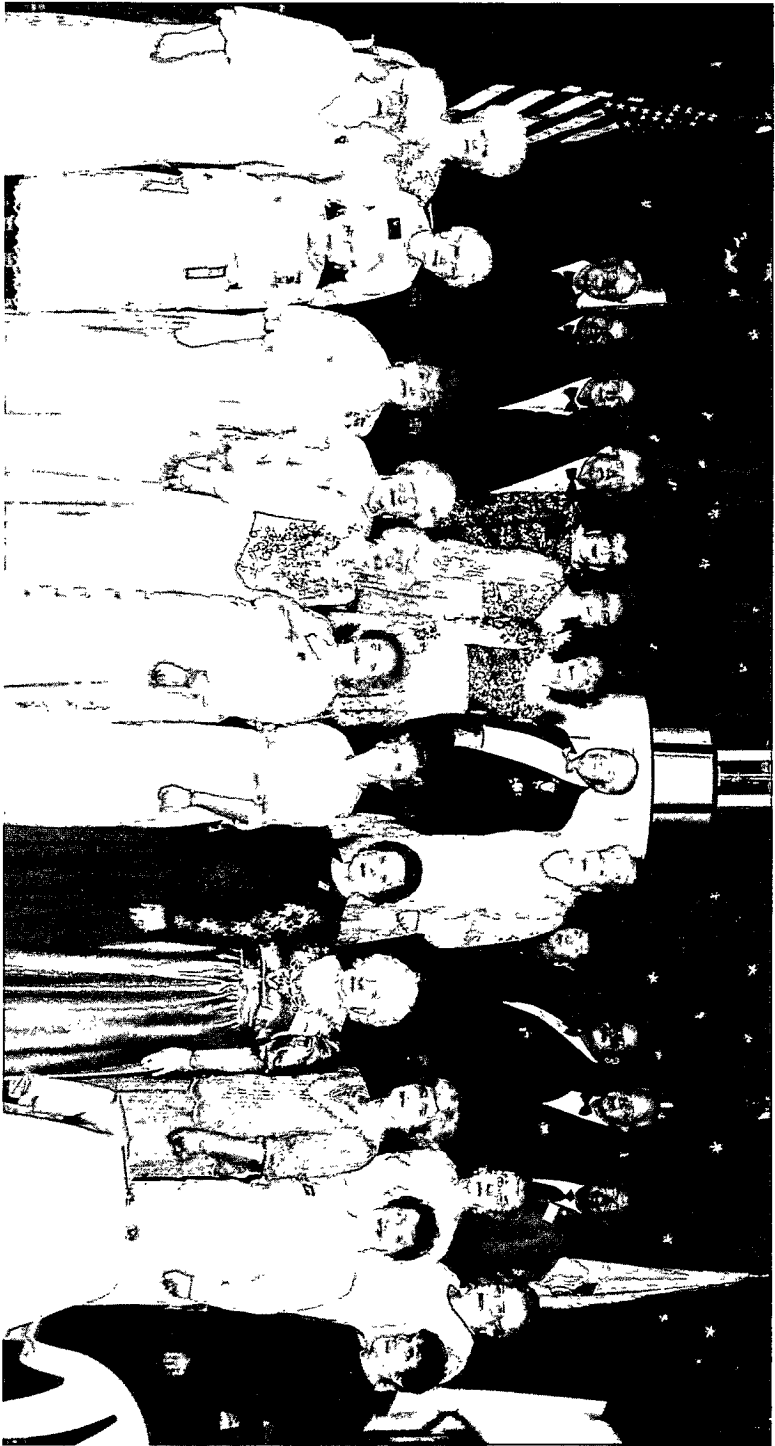

This is a Fraternal Order. However, the Heroines and the lessons they portray come directly from the Word of God. (Bible Bearer and escorts move to Esther.)

There is a Queen in the life of every married man—his Wife. She teaches **LOYALTY.** Her color is white, a symbol of light, purity and joy. Her Emblem is the Crown and Scepter United and her story is found in the book of Esther. (Bible Bearer and escorts move to Martha.)

The closeness of a Sister and Brother is usually unparalleled. This sister teaches **FAITH.** Her color is green and her Emblem is the Broken Column teaching that a faith in God gave her the strength to overcome the deepest sorrow. Her story is found in the book of John. (Bible bearer and escorts move to Electa.)

The story of a Mother's love is taught by this sister. Her color is red. Her Emblem is the cup which teaches us **CHARITY** and **HOSPITALITY.** Her story is found in the Second Epistle of John. (Bible bearer and escorts move to Adah.)

The adoring eyes of a Daughter for her loving Father teaches us the importance of TRUTH. Her color is blue and her Emblem is the Sword and Veil united reminding us of her convictions of right and duty. Her story is found in the Book of Judges. (Bible bearer and escorts move to Ruth.)

PRESENTATION OF THE FLAGS

Brother Gerald E. Stobby, Associate Grand Patron

The flag ceremony this year is dedicated to the ties that bind the Order of the Eastern Star and the Masonic Fraternity in a common bond of friendship, unity and peace. Our aims are similar and cross many lines to achieve common goals. We are both committed to those acts of charity that are designed to benefit those most in need of kindness and understanding.

To remind us of our obligations we also share a common emblem—the five-pointed star. For members of the Order of the Eastern Star, the five rays symbolize fidelity, constancy, loyalty, faith and love. For Masons the five-pointed star reminds us of the five points of fellowship. The principles thus represented are basic to all of the relationships that are essential to man's needs.

Grand Marshall: You will invite the flag presentation team to enter the Grand Chapter room.

We will be presenting and honoring five flags this evening: The flags of the United

States and Canada; the State flag of South Carolina; the flag of the Order of the Eastern Star and the Christian flag.

The flag of the United States of America will be presented by Brother Darrell Gerner, Worthy Patron of Seneca Chapter Number 5.

Members and visitors: Please join with me in the Pledge of Allegiance after which we will sing one verse of our National Anthem.

The Pledge of allegiance is an integral part of all that our flag represents. For, like the Lord's Prayer, there seems to always come forth more significant meaning as the words repeated come to life through repetition.

I pledge allegiance . . .

The flag, symbol of our nation, was conceived, designed and sewn together by loving hands. It established the red stripes as the badge of courage; the white stripes that parallel this courage symbolize the purity of intent of their purpose; the white stars denote the individuality of the several states which found themselves bound together by integrity through unity upon a field of royal blue, symbolically depicting our loyalty to the United Stars of America.

. . . and to the Republic for which it stands . . .

We, the citizens, are all republicans as well as Americans under our republic form of government which is yet the best form of government and wisely chosen by the brilliant minds of those who framed our Constitution and Bill of Rights. It has no relationship to a political party.

. . . One nation under God . . .

Under one God—not God and something else! The one omnipotent, omniscient, omnipresent creative force. God, by whatever name, not under any church or theological persuasion. God selects no church or theological persuasion. God selects no church for there is not a space or place God is not. How deeply important it is to adhere to our Constitution and forever to keep sacred the separation of church and state.

. . . Indivisible . . .

United we stand, as the cement that welds the blocks of a building into one solid mass. In like manner, the cement of patriotism and love of country are the unbreakable bonds that hold the republic's several states united.

. . . With liberty and justice for all . . .

This phrase brings to mind our Declaration of Independence and being liberated from the tyranny of kings, dictators, tsars and churches, all dominators of human lives. Liberty establishes a freedom for us in which to live, move and have our being in agreement with the dictates of our conscience. Each must allow the same privilege to every other citizen, the same choice he appoints to himself or herself, so that freedom, peace and harmony may prevail throughout the nation in such abundance that it shall eventually spread and cover the entire world.

The flag of Canada will be presented by Brother Jake Rimes, Past Patron of Harmony Hope Chapter No. 229.

Members and visitors: Please join with me in singing Canada's National Anthem "O Canada."

The Canadian flag, with its vibrant colors of red and white represents a country secure in its belief and purpose in a modern world. It, too, is a land that stretches from sea to shining sea and encompasses people of many races and ethnic backgrounds. While the flag has seen many changes in design, the maple leaf has been recognized as an emblem identifying Canada since the early 1800s. The stylized maple leaf with its eleven points may also suggest that Canada is a nation composed of a group of eleven provinces and territories united into one nation.

The color red has always signified courage and determination and Canadians can be

proud, as a free people, of the rich legacy left by those staunch pioneers who had a vision of what their land could become. Red also helps to recall the Cross of St. George displayed on the banner brought to North America by English explorers, sailors and soldiers. White is a reminder of the white and gold fleur-de-lis banner of sixteenth and seventeenth century France, brought to these shores by early French explorers and sailors. These two colors are thus a reminder of the two founding nations of Canada.

To Americans, this proud symbol represents friendship and commitment. On a field of blue, a white crescent and a white Palmetto tree wave softly in the Carolina breeze. This, our state flag, is a well-known symbol of South Carolina and its people. Shrouded in legend, its existence, at times forgotten, it was born a simple signal flag during the American Revolution and grew quickly into a symbol of our independence. Forgotten for a time, it reappeared in altered form in 1861 when South Carolina, standing alone, needed an official flag to proclaim its sovereignty. Whether raised above the State House or carried to the moon, this blue flag with its white crescent and white Palmetto stands today as a proud symbol of what South Carolina was and has become.

5. Q. When is the Charter placed in front of the dais in the East?
A. Page 132 Article XIX (3) for deceased "Chapter Members only."
6. Q. What is required to start a new Chapter?
A. SC Constitution and By-Laws page 56 and 57.
7. Q. Can a member holding a Demit protem in a Chapter?
A. Page 136 of SC Constitutions and By-Laws Article XX Sec. 12 states demitted person can visit a Chapter for one year ONLY. I feel if a person can visit then he/she can protem in stations other than the top four Offices and Associate Conductress during Balloting.
8. Q. When is the Dispensation to move the Charter read?

12. Q. What is the correct title of our Order?

If a Chapter expressed the fear of losing their Charter, the opportunity was made available to discuss Consolidation. I'm happy to report that no Charters were surrendered; however, several Chapters did vote to Consolidate!

Dear Sister Maxine:

We thoroughly enjoyed your beautiful Installation Ceremony and, with this, comes our sincere congratulations. We are most grateful to you for the large number of our South Carolina members that you have chosen to serve in your Triennium and the honor these bring to our State.

We were also pleased to be in attendance at your School of Instruction last Friday. We realized you had to be extremely tired and, rather than ask you several questions at that time, we decided to wait and write to you for an official answer.

Our first question is on videotaping an Installation Ceremony. We have taught in our State that this is prohibited by our copyright law as stated on Page 165 in the Ritual, which states that reproduction in any manner is positively prohibited. It is our belief that the *Installation Ceremony is Ritualistic* and that *videotaping is reproduction*. Please give us your official ruling on this.

Our other question concerns whether the Worthy Patron must be a member of the Chapter to serve during Balloting . . . or if you can use a visitor from another Chapter to pro tem during Balloting. We have always taught that only members of the Chapter can Open and Close the Chapter and conduct the business of the Chapter. Our references are Page 12 and Page 34 of the General Grand Chapter Book of Instructions, stated as follows:

Page 12—"The installed officers of a Chapter must preside during the opening and closing of the Chapter and conduct its business." We feel that balloting is a very important part of Chapter business.

Page 34—"It is necessary for *the* Worthy Patron or his pro tem to be present at balloting." Here, we feel that *his pro tem* is *the Associate Patron* of the Chapter.

Another reference that we give to our members is Landmark 11—in the Ritual—wherein it is members of the Chapter that decide who will be members, not a visitor from another Chapter assisting in making such a decision.

Please give us your official ruling on this question.

Thank you for your letter requesting a statement regarding the parameters of the jurisdiction of Socastee Chapter #301.

The information is found in The Constitution and By-Laws of South Carolina on pages 97 and 98. The distance from the home of the person applying for membership to the nearest Chapter is where the person should apply. If this is not where the petitioner desires to become a member, then the Chapter accepting the Petition must secure a waiver of jurisdiction from the Chapter nearest her or his home. The Secretary of the Chapter petitioned shall write the Chapter having the jurisdiction, requesting the waiver. The request is granted upon a majority vote by the Chapter having jurisdiction. All of this must be done under the seal of the Chapter. Also, no action can be taken until a waiver has been received by the petitioning Chapter. This is found on Page 98 under Sec. 5.

If a Chapter ballots on a petitioner without a proper Waiver of Jurisdiction then the Ballot is illegal.

I hope this answers your question; however, in the event that it doesn't, please let me know.

Dear Sister Celia:

I feel I must write you concerning the instructions for installation that were passed on to the District Deputies for distribution to our Chapter Associate Matrons.

To say that when these instructions surfaced has created confusion and dissension would be an understatement.

I am sure all will agree that as our installations are the one time, other than a funeral, that our work is open to the public, we should be as impressive as possible.

In our area, we escort our Installing Officer and the assistants into our Chapter room prior to the meeting to seats that have been reserved for them. These seats are not their installing stations. They do not assume their installing stations until the meeting is called to order as per instruction on page 112 of our By-laws.

It states on page 110 of our By-laws that the Worthy Matron instructs the Conductress to attend at the Altar. This is instructed to be without form. Now, these instructions that were distributed to the Associate Matron direct the Conductress to remain west of the Altar until the Lord's Prayer has been repeated—this is not "without form." This clearly violates Section 8 Paragraph 3.

An installation is a special meeting called for the purpose of installation. To prepare for this meeting, we in this district arrange our chairs in the semicircle prior to the meeting. Nowhere in our Ritual or By-laws is this prohibited. In the General Grand Chapter book of instruction, it does state that the purpose of the recess is only to place the badges on the Altar and the chairs in a semicircle. However, the two lines preceding this states that during the recess the Bible is NOT closed. Of course, our By-laws state on Page 110 that our Bible shall be closed during recess. Our By-laws also allow Bible and Emblem ceremonies and special music during the recess. I am sure that this special music rendered along with a few Brothers setting up 18 chairs in a semicircle would be quite impressive for the assembly, especially the nonmembers.

I have been attending installations in my district for 39 years and I cannot help but wonder how many nonmembers have been added to our rolls by being exposed to the beauty of our Order at an installation.

We believe that our interpretation of our Ritual and By-laws concerning the installation ceremony is as correct as any other. The instructions from our Ritual and By-laws are sufficient. I believe that the instructions received from the District Deputy are a personal interpretation and should not be construed as legal. I especially take offense to the instructions concerning the opening of the Bible by the Conductress "without form."

Therefore the purpose of this letter is to beg your indulgence in allowing our District the privilege of performing our installations as we have in the past. We do not believe that our interpretation violates the Ritual or By-laws in any way.

Copies of this letter are being mailed to all of our elected Grand Officers in the hope that future Worthy Grand Matrons and Patrons will permit only instructions from our Ritual and By-laws verbatim to be distributed to our membership and not interpretations.

I pray that peace and harmony will prevail and that all will be resolved.

Following is a financial report of the Grand Treasurer for the fiscal year May 1, 1994 through April 30, 1995.

This information was given in quarterly typed reports to each of the Grand Trustees as required by S. C. Grand Chapter By-Laws. Separate reports were also provided to the Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Associate Grand Matron, Grand Conductress and Associate Grand Conductress. The firm of Benson, Bultman, King and Palmer, Certified Public Accountants, Sumter, South Carolina was given all the financial records of the Grand Treasurer for audit. Their report will be printed in the 1995 Grand Chapter Proceedings.

On April 2, 1995 a School of Instruction for subordinate Chapter Treasurers was coordinated with the School of Instruction for subordinate Chapter Secretaries in accordance with Grand Chapter By-Laws. It was held at the Masonic Temple on Alice Drive in Sumter, SC. Invitations were sent to each chapter inviting the Secretary, Treasurer, line officers and any interested member. We were delighted to have the Worthy Grand Matron and the Associate Grand Matron with us. Our Grand Secretary, Sister Anna, was a jewel, and it was through her efforts that we had a place to meet. My sincere appreciation goes to her for all her help and to the subordinate Chapter Secretaries and Treasurers for their support.

On January 28, 1995 the Grand Secretary and I received a letter from the Grand Trustees authorizing us to draw checks on the designated funds in the General Fund to pay budgeted expenses if in the event the General Fund did not have sufficient monies. The Grand Chapter of SC has one checking account which contains the General Fund, Benevolence Fund, Cancer Fund, Heart Fund and International Temple Fund. In February, the General Fund went into the red; however due to the above authorization, I

was able to continue paying Grand Chapter bills uninterrupted until funds were transferred to me at the end of the month.

All monies received from the Grand Secretary have been deposited in separate federally insured FDIC checking or investment accounts in the name of the Grand Chapter of SC, OES, and paid out upon receipt of properly executed warrants. The Home Operating Funds and Home Endowment Funds are in accounts at Merrill Lynch and invested in various Certificate of Deposits, U.S. Treasury Notes and Mutual Funds at the highest rates available. PRELIMINARY REPORT OF GRAND TRUSTEES

Dear Sister Anna,

In order that the recommendations of the Grand Trustees may be considered at the annual session, they must be submitted to you at least 90 days before the session to be forwarded to the membership the same as proposed amendments to the Grand Chapter By-Laws.

Accordingly, we submit the following:

Recommendations of the Grand Trustees

Serving as a Grand Trustee is an enlightening experience. Three years of closely monitoring funds of our Grand Chapter has to be a true education for each of us.

In 1984, there were 18,270 members in our Grand Chapter. At the end of 1984, there were 14,092, a reduction of 4,178 members. At the close of this fiscal year there are approximately 13,600 members in our Grand Jurisdiction. In eleven years we have lost 25 percent of our members.

In 1984, Per Capita income for the General Fund was \$45,600.00. Our budgeted income from Per Capita for the 1995-1996 Grand Chapter year, based on a membership of 13,600 is \$34,000.00, a net decrease of \$11,600.00 *per year* in eleven years.

Six years ago, we were operating in the red in the amount of over \$32,000.00.

Where did this money come from? It was borrowed from the designated funds such as the Cancer and Heart Funds and repaid as the Per Capita was received, only to be borrowed again as we dropped into the red again.

We assure you, however, that the integrity of these funds has been maintained and all money donated to Cancer and Heart is accounted for in these funds.

There are inescapable expenses in the operating of our Grand Chapter. The officers charged with the daily operation are especially conscious of these expenses and every effort is made to control them.

Sister Judy Caldwell, Grand Treasurer, has been most judicious in her handling of our funds, reaping the greatest interest available.

Our Worthy Grand Matrons and Worthy Grand Patrons have admirably promoted the projects for the General Fund and they have been a great success.

We have had outside vendors set up shop at our annual sessions and this has benefited Grand Chapter.

Sister Anna Schulz, our Grand Secretary, goes far beyond the call of duty in all that she does and is, to a great extent, the most responsible for the solvency we have now achieved.

This year, for the first time in many years, we were able to keep our heads above the water. The credit for this belongs with those already mentioned and to the membership for your support.

We must continue to work diligently to maintain this solvency. Responsible management requires that we do this.

We must rationally consider that our membership will most likely continue to drop for the next few years. This does not mean that we are headed for extinction but it does mean that more and more will be asked of fewer and fewer members. It is inevitable that we must increase our Per Capita tax in order to spread the responsibility over the entire membership rather than only those who work to support the projects.

Therefore, we make the following recommendations:

1. That Article I, Section 8, of the Grand Chapter By-Laws be amended to increase the Per Capita tax to \$6.00, of which \$3.00 will be for the General Fund and \$3.00 for the operation of the Eastern Star Home. Further, that all related references to Per Capita be so amended.

2. That the funds designated Heart Fund and Cancer Fund be separated from the General Fund. Should our fiscal condition require that future borrowing be done from these funds, it can be documented and restored as soon as possible.

3. That any request for benevolent assistance from our members be examined to find if the need is related to cancer or heart conditions and, if so, that relief be granted from these funds.

4. That our Grand Chapter continue to sponsor a project for the General Fund each year.

REPORT OF THE GRAND TRUSTEES

We extend to you our sincere appreciation for the privilege of serving our Grand Chapter as Grand Trustees.

As Chairman of the Grand Trustees, I wish to submit for your consideration and approval, the following report.

The Trustees have met a number of times to discuss matters pertaining to the general condition of Grand Chapter. We have offered recommendations to those responsible for the day-to-day activities concerning the finances of the General Fund and have exercised a general supervision of the other funds, including the OES Home Funds.

We have found everyone involved has a genuine concern for responsible action and insuring that the money placed in their hands was managed with the greatest efficiency and accountability.

You will read in the Home Report of the situations they faced during the year and the Home Board, collectively and individually, should be commended for it's diligence.

Sister Andrea Barry, PSN Editor, has had some deep footprints to follow and has faced a traumatic year in her young life. But she has persevered and we commend her efforts on behalf of our PSN. The financial condition of the paper has remained sound.

We are especially grateful to Sister Anna Schulz for her efforts as our Grand Secretary. She goes far beyond the line of duty to contain expenses and her records are beyond reproach. Thank you, Anna, for meeting and exceeding every request I made of you this year. There is no way to measure the benefits to Grand Chapter from your service.

Grand Chapter has also benefited from the efforts of Sister Judy Caldwell, our Grand Treasurer, who has diligently followed the money market places and has invested our funds both wisely and safely. In a period when rates were the lowest, she has made the most for the Grand Chapter that could be harvested. Thank you, Judy, for keeping me informed during the year.

We have enjoyed a close relationship with our Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy

Grand Patron and have found them to be responsible and concerned about the finances of Grand Chapter. The project for the General Fund was great success.

On September 25, 1994, Sister Maxine Justice, now Most Worthy Grand Matron, contacted me concerning her itinerary in relation to our Grand Chapter session in 1997. Briefly, she has floor officers in North Carolina and South Carolina. It is her desire to attend both sessions in 1997.

By our By-Laws, we meet June 16-18, 1997. North Carolina meets at the same time and according to Sister Maxine, has a commitment which cannot be changed. She has asked us, if at all possible, to change our session for that one year only, to the following week, June 23-25, 1997. It is her desire to attend the entire session, from fun night through installation. I present this to you for your consideration and action at this session.

Finally, I hope that you have read the preliminary report of the Grand Trustees. The conditions explained continue and although we hoped we would be able to stay completely in the black financially, this was not the case. We were forced to use designated funds for a short while before per capita came in with the annual returns. At the close of the fiscal year we were again solvent but the immediate cash flow problems continued.

Consequently, to avoid placing additional burdens upon our Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer, the Trustees wish to withdraw the recommendation to remove the Heart and Cancer Funds from the General Fund. We do strongly encourage our members to accept the proposal to increase per capita in order that we can soon accomplish this separation and have fiscal responsibility in all branches of our Grand Chapter. Per capita was last increased in 1983. Since then our membership has decreased by a fourth while virtually every expense the Grand Chapter faces has increased.

I express my sincere appreciation to Sister Shirley Stuart, P.G.M., and Brother Harold Winchester, P.G.P., for their support this year. It has been a pleasure to serve with you. I wish you well.

**NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS
APRIL 30, 1995**

NOTE 1—ORGANIZATION

Grand Chapter of South Carolina Order of the Eastern Star (the Order) was organized as a nonprofit corporation under the laws of the state of South Carolina in 1916. The Organization was formed for fraternal, social, and religious purposes.

In carrying out this basic purpose, the Order has established facilities for a retirement home that it supports and maintains for the use of its qualified members.

NOTE 2—SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The policy of the Grand Chapter of South Carolina Order of the Eastern Star is to prepare its financial statements on the cash basis of accounting; consequently, certain revenues are recognized when received rather than when earned, and certain expenses and purchases of assets are recognized when cash is disbursed rather than when the obligation is incurred. The accounting records are maintained on a fiscal year ending April 30th. The significant accounting policies followed by the Eastern Star are described below to enhance the usefulness of the financial statements.

Cash and Equivalents

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, all highly liquid debt instruments purchased with an original maturity of three months or less are considered to be cash equivalents.

The Eastern Star maintains cash balances at several banks. Accounts at each institution are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation up to \$ 100,000.

Fund Accounting

To insure observance of limitations and restrictions placed on the use of resources available to the Eastern Star, the accounts of the Eastern Star are maintained in accordance with the principles of fund accounting. This is the procedure by which resources for various purposes are accounted for according to their nature and purposes. Separate accounts are maintained for each fund.

The assets, liabilities, and fund balances of the Eastern Star are reported in five self-balancing fund groups as follows:

1. *Current funds—undesignated* represent the portion of expendable funds that are available for support of Eastern Star operations.
2. *Current funds—designated* represent funds that are subject to restrictions imposed by the board, requiring that the principal be invested or spent for specific expenditures or that certain events must occur before the funds are considered expendable.
3. *Plant fund* represents the fixed assets of the Eastern Star that have been purchased over the years.
4. *Quasi-Endowment funds* are donations received by the Eastern Star subject to board-imposed restrictions requiring that the principal and income be invested to establish necessary funds to finance the Home operations in the future.
5. *Trust funds* represent funds that are subject to restrictions of gift instruments requiring that the principal be invested and the income only be used or that certain events must occur before the funds are considered expendable.

Land, Buildings and Equipment

Land, buildings and equipment are stated at original cost. Depreciation is calculated using the straight-line method over the estimated useful life of the related asset.

Inventory

Stores and supplies are valued at lower of cost (primarily first-in, first-out) or market.

Income Taxes

The Eastern Star is a nonprofit organization exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(10) of the Internal Revenue Code.

NOTE 3—CONTRIBUTED SERVICES

A substantial number of unpaid volunteers have made significant contributions of their time to help defray the cost of Eastern Star's operations. No amounts have been reflected in these financial statements for donated services inasmuch as no objective basis is available to measure the value of such services.

NOTE 4—INVESTMENTS

Investments are presented in the financial statements in the aggregate at lower of cost or fair market value. Investments are composed of U.S. government obligations. The following tabulation summarizes the relationship between carrying value and market values of investments.

Fidelity bond coverage of \$500,000 on the Grand Treasurer, \$100,000 on the Grand Secretary, \$25,000 on the President of the Home Board, \$25,000 on the Administrator, \$1,000 on the Chairman of the Grand Trustees and \$ 1,000 on the Worthy Grand Matron is carried. These bonds expire in July, 1995.

NOTE 6—PRIOR PERIOD ADJUSTMENT

Subsequent to the issuance of the reviewed April 30, 1994 financial statements, it was determined that general fund's undesignated fund balance needed to be restated at April 30, 1994 for the financial statements to be in conformity with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles. Had the financial statements been in conformity with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles, total assets for April 30, 1994 would have increased by \$2,000. There would be no effect on excess of support and revenues over expenses.

Since this is the first report, Worthy Grand Matron, I want to thank you and Brother Glen for appointing such a nice committee for me to work with. They are wonderful and everybody is working well together. Thank you very much for a very knowledgeable group of people.

This Jurisprudence Committee met on Saturday, June 17, 1995 according to our By-Laws and the committee has reviewed the following reports today and find them legal:

The Worthy Grand Matron

The payments for these costs come from your Building, Major Repair and Maintenance Fund, and/or the Operating Fund.

You might ask, "What seems to be the problem?" The problem is, the lack of participation by your sisters and brothers. You are doing your part but your sisters and brothers are not. The ugly fact remains . . . a large percentage of our membership do not, and apparently have no intentions to, support the operation of our home.

We all realize that a number of changes have occurred over the last few years, taxes, insurance, wages, and prices in general have gone up, and the interest on our savings has gone down and our spending habits have changed and some of us, you and I, have been dipping into our savings to make ends meet. We cannot and will not dip into our home savings.

What are we going to do? How do we solve our problems? Do you have any ideas? We need constructive ideas and we need them now.

We have about fourteen thousand members, and our membership is decreasing about five hundred members each year. If only ten thousand members made one ten dollar honorarium or memorial to the Operating Fund, we would realize one hundred thousand dollars for your home. If this same ten thousand members contributed one dollar per month, in a year's time we would have one hundred and twenty thousand for your home for a total of two hundred twenty thousand dollars. Now add in the per capita, profit from peanuts, income from residents and we are nearing three hundred thousand dollars per year.

REPORT OF THE EASTERN STAR HOME BOARD

Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, my Sisters and Brothers:

Another page has been written in the history of your Eastern Star Home. How good or how bad will be determined in the future. Your Home Board, after prayerful considerations, based all of their decisions on what seemed best at the time. There is a complete set of minutes on file at your O.E.S. Home. You are welcome to read these minutes. Overall, the year went rather smoothly. I will relate some of the highlights.

In June, your Home Board had their election of officers. The results were:

- President Charles Parker
- Vice President Mary Mozelle Baker
- Secretary William Clement

In August, the name of the Building Fund was changed to Home Building, Major Repair and Maintenance Fund.

In September, Sister Juanita Tucker was rehired as Matron of your Home.

In December, there were several Christmas parties for the residents.

In January, Brother Lerans Welch requested a well-deserved retirement. Brother Lerans has spent 22 years of service for the Home, 10 of which were on the Home Board. Brother Lerans, we hope you enjoy many years of retirement and good health, and I know we will see you at the Home quite often.

Sister Juanita, the matron, is resigning. The effective date is 1 February, but will stay until 1 March. Her resignation was accepted with regret. Sister Juanita gave your Home five years of devoted and unselfish duty. We didn't get a formal resignation from her husband, Bill, but assumed that he would be leaving also. The residents love Bill Tucker. We thank you, Bill, especially for your Saturday night devotions and your morale building in the Home. We also thank you for all maintenance and odd jobs you did for our Home. You saved us countless dollars.

In February, Brother Lerans gave formal notice that he would retire 1 March. Lerans will stay on until an orderly transition has taken place.

After prayerful consideration, the Board decided to try something new for your home for a period of six months, at which time we will evaluate the program and make necessary changes. We are eliminating the position of Matron. We will hire a manager, a supervisor, and three shift supervisors. The chain of command will be: administrator, manager, supervisor, and shift supervisor. This will require no new employees. Until a new administrator is hired, Lerans will be in charge.

Patricia Nelson, our present bookkeeper and secretary, will take on the added duties of manager. Juanita Weston will be the supervisor. Remember, this system is for a six-month trial basis.

In March, Brother Sam Ramey of Sumter was accepted as administrator. The transition period will commence 8 March.

April: The new system, from all indications, is working. There are a few "bugs" that will be ironed out.

Death never takes a vacation. We have lost seven residents during the past year. Sisters Thelma Busbee, Alice Allen, Mamie Sherman, Mable Crosby, Lillie Long, Madeline Brown and Thelma Welch. We lost three by transfers, Sisters Katie Rabon, Beulah Revell, and Mary Mathis. As of now, we have 23 residents. We are at less than half of our licensed capacity of 49. We took in only two new residents, Louise Putnam and Sarah Holladay. We had a net loss of eight.

There are a few people we must thank for doing a little extra:

Sister Eunice Rogers, Chairperson of the \$100 Endowment Club;

Brother Dave Brown, Chairman of the Grand Trustees. In my five years on the Board, he is the only Grand Trustee to attend most of our meetings;

Sister Mary Mozelle Baker, the Vice President, for her work on the budget—and having been in personnel work for many years, she offered a lot in starting the new system;

Brother Tom Swindler and Azalea Chapter, for their many donations of time, money and material items;

The Merry-Makers, for keeping our residents looking beautiful;

Grand Chapter, WGM, WGP, Districts, Chapters, Sisters, Brothers and Friends, for keeping our Home solvent;

The Aides to the Home, for helping keep up the morale of the residents;

Staff and Management, for being one team, working together for the comfort of our residents;

And lastly, but not least, to God for His support and guidance in all our undertakings.

We have a few suggestions that might make life easier:

1. Check with management before donating a large quantity of anything, except money;
2. If a death occurs in the Home, management must notify the Chapter Worthy Matron.

Since the position of Worthy Matron sometimes changes each year and her name is sent in on the annual report, please send her phone number also, to be included in the Proceedings;

3. If you have any criticism, constructive or otherwise, put it in writing and send to the Home Board.

We thank each of you for your contributions to the Home, and may God bless.

Worthy Grand Matron: Thank you, Sister Anna. Now we have to take action on the proposed Grand Chapter By-law changes. I remind you we are being recorded. If you have comments, questions or discussion, please go to one of the microphones, speak clearly and directly into the microphone.

Worthy Grand Patron, it is my pleasure to invite you to preside during the voting on the proposed changes to our By-laws. Thank you.

Worthy Grand Patron: Thank you, Worthy Grand Matron. Brother Fred Caldwell, are you ready to come to the East and present the report from the Jurisprudence Committee so we can take up the proposed by-law changes?

PARTIAL REPORT OF THE JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE

Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Sisters and Brothers:

We, your Jurisprudence Committee, have just had a recent change. Will each of you take your copy of the Addresses and Reports and turn to the proposed bylaw changes?

Changes by the Proposer to the printed proposed Bylaw changes follows:

1. From the Home Board, Charles Parker, President, as submitted by him at the bottom of page 110, change #1 has been withdrawn.

On the same page change #3 has been withdrawn.

The balance of everything that's left from pages 110 and 111 as submitted by the Home Board remains the same and has been found legal if adopted.

2. From the Grand Trustees, David Brown, Chairman. On page 109 at the top of your page beginning at the second paragraph "that the funds designated heart and cancer fund be separated" that was withdrawn. This was a recommendation, just delete the paragraph it starts with "that" and ends with "possible."

Now the next two paragraphs are considered proposals. Proposals are good for only one year and they were not submitted as a bylaw.

The first paragraph at the top of page 109 is considered legal if adopted.

I move the adoption of this report then we will report on all other proposed bylaw changes.

We, your Jurisprudence Committee, find all other proposed bylaw changes to be legal if adopted with the following exceptions:

Proposers Linda Lamb, P.M. New Brookland Chapter #104 and David Brown, P.G.P., P.P., Cayce Chapter #260.

Page 107, change (#3) as listed in the addresses and reports pertains to not paying per capital tax and will have to be declared illegal. Strike out that portion of the bylaw change.

Page 107, change (#5), also pertains to not paying per capita tax by a dual member and has been considered illegal. Strike that out.

Now the reason being and we feel we need to justify this to you as the member. If this bylaw was to pass and this was included in it where you did not pay per capital tax as a dual member we felt that it would violate your rights as a dual member and you became one of the top four officers. Now if you did not pay per capita in that chapter then you could not vote. That chapter would lose its ballot or vote. This is the reason this was declared illegal.

I move the adoption of this report.

Brother Fred: You have heard the proposed changes that the Jurisprudence Committee made and the list of withdrawals as you had then printed, the last changes we talked bout were (#3) and (#5), page 107, would be declared not legal.

I move the adoption of this report. Is there any discussion?

PROPOSED CHANGES TO GRAND CHAPTER BYLAWS

Proposed by Carolyn Stobby, P.M., Clemson Chapter #191, and Dorothy Young, P.M., Easley Chapter #200, O.E.S.

Page 15, Article I, Section 1. The Annual Session of this Grand Chapter shall be held on the third Monday evening in the month of June in such place as may be determined by a majority vote of The Grand Chapter. The informal opening of Grand Chapter shall be held no longer than four hours, between 5:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. The Formal Opening of The Grand Chapter will begin at 9:00 p.m. . . . (The rest of the paragraphs shall remain as written.) Defeated.

Proposed by H. David Brown, P.G.P., P.P., Cayce Chapter #260, O.E.S.
Page 46, EASTERN STAR HOME, Article 1

2. This Board shall consist of fifteen members and shall be composed of six elected Home Board Members for a term of three years each, the W.G.M., W.G.P., A.G.M., A.G.P., Grand Secretary, Grand Treasurer, Grand Conductress, Associate Grand Conductress and Grand Sentinel.

3. At each session of the Grand Chapter of S.C., Order of the Eastern Star, members at such sessions shall elect two members to the Home Board for a term of three years, and the W.G.M., W.G.P., A.G.M., A.G.P., Grand Secretary, Grand Treasurer, Grand Conductress, Associate Grand Conductress and Grand Sentinel shall assume their duties as members of the Board.

4. No member shall be elected to the Board for more than two consecutive full terms.
Carried.

To clarify this, Mary Mozelle Baker and William "Bill" Clement would come off of the Board in June of 1996, and two new members would be elected. Kenneth Lambert and Tom Swindler would come off in June of 1997. Two new members would again be elected. Any of these would be eligible for re-election to a three-year term at the completion of their regular term. Motion to print carried.

Proposed by Linda F. Lamb, P.M., New Brookland Chapter #104 and H. David Brown, P.G.P., P.P., Cayce Chapter #260, O.E.S.

Inasmuch as many of the Chapters in our Grand Chapter Jurisdiction are unable to install a complete corps of officers, and often a quorum cannot be gathered to hold a meeting, and that members of sister Chapters are willing to come to the aid of a troubled Chapter, and consolidation or surrender of charter is not always the best solution, and as many of our members who move about the state with their family or job situations but hold ties to their home chapter dear, but would be willing to help in a local Chapter, and as some of our members who choose to reside at our Home in Sumter are still able to participate in a Chapter, the following amendment to our Grand Chapter Bylaws is proposed.

Page 102, ARTICLE VI, Petitions—Section 8. Dual Membership. Be renamed Dual Membership Other Grand Jurisdictions.

Section 9. Be renamed Dual Membership within Jurisdiction.

(1) Dual membership is permitted for any member in good standing in any Chapter in This Grand Jurisdiction with any other Chapter in the state.

(2) The procedure in receiving and acting upon any petition for such Dual Membership shall be the same as that of any petition for affiliation.

(3) In-state Dual Members must remain in good standing in their primary chapter and must pay dues to each chapter to which they claim membership. Provided that any chapter except the primary chapter shall pro-rate the dues of these members to exclude the Grand Chapter Per-Capita fee. Illegal.

(4) In-state Dual members shall be entitled to all of the rights and privileges of regular membership, including holding an office, provided that no member may serve as an elected officer in more than one Chapter at any time.

(5) Such Dual Members will be reported on the Annual Return separate from regular members and Per-Capita shall not be paid for in-state Dual Members except by their primary Chapter. Illegal.

Previous Section 9. be renumbered Section 10.

Previous Section 10. be renumbered Section 11.

Should this amendment pass, the following changes would have to be made and are thus proposed:

Article I, Section 8 (b), Annual Dues. At the end of the paragraph, add: Per-Capita shall not be charged for in-state Dual Members, except by the Chapter in which they hold primary membership.

Article III, Section 5 (a). Add at end of paragraph titled Quorum: In-state Dual Members shall be counted for the purpose of establishing a quorum. Defeated.

I'm Vernon Force. It's evident that the question now before us needs further study. I therefore move to commit the question to a committee to be appointed by the incoming Worthy Grand Matron to be acted upon at the next Grand Chapter Session.

Worthy Grand Patron: Brother Vernon, are you making a motion to table this proposed bylaw?

Brother Vernon: No sir, I am making a motion to commit, Robert's Rules of Order.

Worthy Grand Patron: We have a motion on the floor, I believe we have to vote on first.

Brother Vernon: A motion to commit overrides the main question. Robert's Rules of Order, page 167.

Worthy Grand Patron: Alright. We will vote on the motion to commit, second, any discussion, it is soundly defeated.

The proposed bylaw to allow dual membership within South Carolina was defeated after lengthy discussion.

Proposed by Judy B. Caldwell, G.G.C.C.M., P.G.M., P.M., Columbia Chapter #59, O.E.S.

No. 1 Page 125—Article XIV (8), Financial Responsibility—Add at end of paragraph:

"However, once procedures for consolidation have begun, the chapter seeking consolidation shall not sell or donate properties, dispose of any funds or close any chapter accounts."

Article XIV (8), Financial Responsibility would then read:

The chapter losing its identity shall carry on regular chapter business as its stated meetings until the consolidation is completed and shall be responsible for all its financial obligations. However, once procedures for consolidation have begun, the chapter seeking consolidation shall not sell or donate any properties, dispose of any funds or close any chapter accounts.

No. 2 Page 126—Article XIV—Following (8), add:

"(9) Petitions—A chapter seeking consolidation with another chapter shall not entertain petitions for the degrees, affiliation, dual membership or reinstatement once a proposal to consolidate has been presented."

No. 3 Page 126—Article XIV—"Renumber existing (9) to (10)"

No. 4 Page 92, Article III, Section 9 (n) Signing of Bylaws and welcome, add at end of the last sentence in the first paragraph: "upon payment of dues." The sentence would then read:

After the new members have signed, they will be given an official membership card upon payment of dues.

No. 5 Page 111, Article XI Installation of Officers, Section 8 (2) Introductions—Following paragraph 1, delete remainder and replace with: "Introduction shall be handled in the same manner as prescribed in Article III Chartered Chapters, Section 6, (c) Procedure of Introduction. Those to be introduced shall be presented in the same manner as outlined in (d), (1) through (8).

Following the Grand Officers, other Guests to be introduced may be presented and introduced in the same manner or may be called up and introduced at their seats; either way, they should be introduced according to rank and given a hearty welcome."

(Explanation: This will allow the Worthy Matron, Conductress and Associate Conductress to continue doing the Introductions the same way they have all year.)

No. 6 Page 83, Article III, Section 6 (c) Procedure of Introduction (e)—Delete and change to read:

(e) Open Installation—See Article XI, Section 8 (2) Introductions.

No. 7 Page 101, Article VI, Section 5 (2), Delete paragraph and replace with: (2) Documents must Accompany.—No Chapter in this jurisdiction shall entertain a petition for affiliation unless it is accompanied by a demit or a letter from the petitioner's Chapter, under its seal, stating that she or he is in good standing and under no charges.

No. 8 Page 101, Article VI, Section 5, Petition for Affiliation by Demit. Delete the words "by Demit." It would then read: Petition for Affiliation.

No. 9 Page 102, Article VI, Section 6, Petition for Affiliation by Reinstatement: Delete words "Affiliation by." It would then read: Petition for Reinstatement. Carried.

Proposed by the Grand Trustees—H. David Brown, P.G.P.—Chairman, P.P. Cayce Chapter #260; Shirley M. Stuart, P.G.M. Member, P.M. John L. Flynn Chapter #277 and D. Harold Winchester, P.G.P. Member; P.P. Dunean Chapter #191.

Page 18, Article I, Section 8 (b) of the Grand Chapter Bylaws be amended to increase the Per Capita Tax to \$6.00 of which \$3.00 will be for the General Fund and \$3.00 for the operation of the Eastern Star Home. Further, that all related references to Per Capita be so amended. Carried.

That the funds designated Heart Fund and Cancer Fund be separated from the General Fund. Should our fiscal condition require that future borrowing be done from these funds, it be documented and restored soon as possible. Withdrawn.

That any request for benevolent assistance from our members be examined to find if the need is related to cancer or heart condition and, if so, that relief be granted from these funds. Resolution Carried.

That our Grand Chapter continue to sponsor a project for the General Fund each year. Resolution Defeated.

Worthy Grand Patron: I now turn this helm over to our Captain, Sister Celia Bradshaw.

Worthy Grand Matron: I do apologize but I am going to call for one report. It is necessary to take care of this report right now. I recognize Sister Mary Fogle, Past Grand Matron.

Sister Mary: Just as soon as my Committee comes up here I am going to try to change our trend this morning. This report I know is going to be of interest and concern. It has been proven already by the record. I am just delighted to make it in this manner and it is only by you that it is being made.

PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE GRAND CHAPTER BYLAWS (Continued)

Proposed by Anna Schultz, P.M., Beuclare Chapter #20, O.E.S.

Page 102, Article VI, Section 6. Petition for Affiliation by Reinstatement. The third line after the word member, delete "when" and add "for the year." The sentence would then read: Petition for reinstatement in a chapter must be accompanied by the amount of dues owed by the member for the year suspended, plus the amount of dues charged by the chapter for the year in which reinstatement is being requested, plus reinstatement fee of \$5.00.

Page 102, Article VI, Section 8. Dual Membership.—Third line of paragraph (2) change the period to comma and add provided that:

(a) The Chapter Secretary advises the Grand Secretary prior to accepting an application for dual membership. The Grand Secretary will verify whether the other Grand Jurisdiction or Chapter under the General Grand Chapter permits Dual Membership, if so, she (he) will forward to the Chapter Secretary an application for Dual Membership and the necessary form to notify the Primary Chapter should the petitioner be elected.

(b) Prior to accepting a petition for dual membership, the Chapter Secretary must obtain from the Secretary of the Primary Chapter written certification that the petitioner is a member in good standing and no indebtedness or charges are pending against her (him). Upon receipt of the certification, under seal of the Primary Chapter, the petition may be accepted with the fee and read at the first stated meeting. (CURRENT DUES CARDS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AS PROOF OF MEMBERSHIP.)

Add the following new paragraph after paragraph (3):

(4) The Secretary of the Secondary Chapter must write to the Primary Chapter each year requesting certification of good standing before accepting dues and issuing new dues cards.

(5) A member that is suspended for non-payment of dues in their primary Chapter, or expulsion in either Chapter, carries with it the loss of membership in the other Chapter. (Page 52, G.G.C. Constitution)

(6) Should a dual member desire to terminate their membership in the Secondary Chapter, they must submit a written request for a demit. When the demit is granted the Secretary of the Secondary Chapter must notify the Primary Chapter immediately.

(7) A dual member that terminates their membership in their Primary Chapter and desires to retain membership in their Secondary Chapter must submit a written request with the DEMIT to the chapter to change their membership from dual to affiliated and the Chapter from Secondary to Primary. At the next stated meeting, the request is read, if there is no objection, the Worthy Matron makes a declaration that the request is granted. Vote of the Chapter or processing an application for affiliation is not required. The individual is already a member through proper affiliation. All records are posted accordingly. Carried.

Page 23, Article III, Section 1. Paragraph (c), delete the last sentence in this paragraph.

Page 23, Article III, Section 1. Paragraph (d), add new paragraph (d) as follows: She shall with the assistance of the Grand Lecturer, if appointed, conduct all schools of Instruction in twelve (12) areas of the State with the Districts grouped as follows:

- Area one Districts 1 and 7
- Area two Districts 2 and 21
- Area three Districts 3 and 23
- Area four Districts 4 and 24
- Area five Districts 5 and 6
- Area six Districts 8 and 16
- Area seven Districts 9 and 11
- Area eight Districts 10 and 22
- Area nine Districts 17 and 12
- Area ten Districts 13 and 14
- Area eleven Districts 15 and 18
- Area twelve Districts 19 and 20

All work shall be exemplified by the Grand Officers and in their absence, the Worthy Grand Matron shall appoint someone.

Introductions shall be to the discretion of the Worthy Grand Matron.

The presence of a charter or dispensation is not required at the School of Instruction.

(Reletter existing paragraph (d) and succeeding paragraphs in this section accordingly.)

Page 39, Article V, Section 1. Duties of District Deputies—paragraph (c). Delete the entire paragraph and add the following in its place:

The District Deputies, with the advice and consent of the Worthy Grand Matron, shall select a site and make all necessary arrangements for the school. The Deputies shall meet with representatives of the Chapters in the Area and decide on the expenses of the school, which shall be borne by all chapters in the Area in proportion to membership. An itemized statement shall be prepared by the deputies and sent to each chapter.

The Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron shall oversee that the deputies work together for the good of the Area. Defeated (213 for—219 Against).

Proposed by the Home Board, Charles Parker, President, P.P., Jessie Belle Shonk Chapter #269.

Change #1. See David Brown's proposal on page 1. Withdrawn.

Change #2. Page 52, Article II, paragraph 7 (i), now reads: "Applicant must report to the Home for admission within thirty days after acceptance by the Home Board."

Change to Read: Applicant must report to the Home for admission within thirty days after acceptance by the Home Board for a 120 day trial period. Carried.

Change #3. Page 51, paragraph 7 (a), now reads: "Applicant must be a member of the Order of the Eastern Star in good standing in a Subordinate Chapter in the Grand Jurisdiction of South Carolina for five consecutive years prior to the time the application for admittance to the Home is made, of good character, free from insanity, or contagious or infectious diseases, of temperate habits, not addicted to the use of narcotics, or alcoholic beverages. If admitted, member must agree to comply with the rules of the Home."

Change to Read: Applicant must be a member of the Order of the Eastern Star in good standing for 5 consecutive years prior to the time the application for admittance to the Home is made, of good character, ambulatory, reasonably good health, must be able to care for self with a minimum of assistance, free from insanity, or contagious of infectious disease, not addicted to the use of narcotics or alcoholic beverages. When the residents health deteriorates to the point of being unable to care for themselves, other arrangements must be made. If admitted, member and family members must agree to comply with the rules of the Home. Withdrawn.

REPORT OF THE PALMETTO STAR NEWS EDITOR

Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Distinguished Guests, my Sisters and Brothers:

This past year as editor of the *Palmetto Star News* has been a challenging and enlightening year as well as an enjoyable one. As there always is when there is a changeover, there were a few glitches and problems that had to be worked out. However through the support and patience of the publication committee and especially this Grand Body everything seems to have worked out well. For that I thank you and hope that in the next two years your support and patience will continue.

This year several new things as well as variations on old things have been done with the paper. One was the monthly quiz. There was a good response from the women; however the men, with the exception of a few, did not seem to participate. They need to get on the ball and let us know they are out there. The purpose of this type of quiz was to increase my knowledge as well as the knowledge of the membership of our history of the Order in South Carolina. The participants of the quiz with the correct answer all received a certificate certifying their Doctorate in Thinkology as well as a small prize.

Another new item we tried was our first edition of the Souvenir issue of the *Palmetto Star News*. This edition was approved by the Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron as well as the Associate Grand Matron and Associate Grand Patron as a fundraiser for the PSN. The purpose of this fundraiser was to raise money to help offset the cost of the paper in the future in order to help keep subscription rates down. The issue has been a success I feel. Currently we have taken in \$3,261.00 from sales and stargrams. The printing cost for 500 copies was \$2,034.06 and \$100 is being allowed for mailing at \$1.35 per issue. This leaves a profit as of 9:00 this morning of \$1,126.94. I hope to have a final amount to report tomorrow. We still have some extra issues left and I hope that everyone who has not

purchased a copy will, as they will be a good keepsake of Grand Chapter. Out of state guests are also encouraged to purchase one to take home. Several copies of the issue will be donated to the Home for the enjoyment of Residents.

This year due to the death of my grandfather only eleven issues were printed. However the membership did get twelve months of information and I apologize for the inconvenience. The financial status of the *Palmetto Star News* is as follows:

The Order forms a bond of love and understanding among its members throughout the world and enables us to spread brotherly love by living our lives according to the lessons taught by the Heroines of our Order. Ours is a great organization. The Order does many things for each of us and in turn many things for many others. Ours is a helping organization.

Everyday all year long our members are, each in their own way, helping each other, their neighbor, their church, their children, their family, and this happens because we have good members. Members whose loving and caring can make a difference. To continue to have good, caring members whose efforts can make a difference, we must continue to exist.

On our journey we learned many interesting facts about individual Grand Jurisdictions. California has a Circle of Concern instead of sickness and distress. California also sends out resumes for those running for elected Grand Offices. Indiana has seven chapters with membership over 650. Kansas presented fourteen seventy-five-year pins. Michigan has six chapters with over 500 members. The largest chapter has 712. Nebraska does an initiation at their Grand Session. Rhode Island's Grand Session only lasts one day. The Worthy Grand Matron installs all twenty-three chapter officers. New York is the oldest Grand Chapter and is the only jurisdiction to use the McCoy Ritual and to display the Emblematic Star with the white point up. New Jersey is the second oldest and uses a modified Rob Morris Ritual. In Iowa and Oregon the Grand Officers confer the Degrees in seven Chapters each year. In Iowa not even the official prompter may use a Ritual. Texas has the most Chapters. In Michigan each chapter must exemplify an initiation twice per year. In Kansas the subordinate chapters must exemplify the degrees four times a year or forfeit their charter. Kansas and Texas place the square and compasses on the Bible during the opening ceremony. In New York women candidates wear a veil until after their obligation. Indiana has all members take a proficiency test. One of their five Grand Star Points is elected Associate Grand Conductress. In Oregon none of the Grand Line Officers are permitted to ride in the same car, boat or plane. Iowa has a State School which lasts three days. All phases of the Ritualistic work is done. Although each Jurisdiction enjoys having their own theme, colors, aims and goals for the year to express their individualities, our foundation is the same.

The Open Bible rests upon the Altar of every Chapter and respect is always given to the Bible and Flag. If the Order of the Eastern Star satisfies the demands of the ages and is worthy of existence, it will live and take its place among the Institutions of the Land. Let us be proud to be a member of the Order of the Eastern Star and let it show in our daily living.

The Grand Trustees make no recommendation for action but in order to bring it on the floor, I move that we honor her request and change our session in June 1997 to delay it one week or the fourth Monday in June 1997.

Worthy Grand Matron: Alright do I hear a second, is there any discussion? I recognize Sister Marlene Wilds.

Marlene Wilds: Worthy Grand Matron, I know what Sister Maxine would like to do and I do know she is coming next year but I also know when I was working that the third week in June was my standing week of vacation. **REPORT OF THE GENERAL CHAIRMAN

When I received this assignment, I talked with Brother Charles Peterson, Past Grand Patron and Chairman of this committee last year. He gave me what information he had concerning vendors, names, addresses and the type of material each sells.

Early in December 1994, I made an appointment with Mr. John Chiles, a member of the Staff at the Sheraton Hotel. I furnished him with names, addresses, phone numbers and the committees that would need his personal attention. We had a very productive meeting and he was most helpful and he pointed out some of the problems he had to work out in previous sessions. Sister Shirley Shipp, Chairman of the Arrangements Committee, appeared to be the one that would need a lot of help so I concentrated on her committee.

January 16, 1995 I again met with Mr. Chiles and two committee chairmen. (Sister Mary Coggins, District Deputy Grand Matrons and Patrons' Breakfast, and Brother Charles Peterson, Past Grands' Luncheon.) There were others which Mr. Chiles contacted and helped set up for their committees which I was unable to attend.

January 28, 1995, I mailed form letters to all vendors who made our Grand Session last year plus a couple of new ones. I also enclosed housing forms for the hotel. The early notification was given to give each vendor a chance to work out their schedules, since some of them travel from state to state as a means of their livelihood. On March 10, 1995, I became concerned because I had not received a single reply. I did receive two inquiries concerning security for vendor's material during the night. Mr. Chiles and I had already discussed this subject since we had had an unfortunate situation last year. I informed the two vendors that the hotel does not furnish security. However, arrangements would be

made with one of the local security forces and if desired it would cost \$12.00 per hour and the amount would have to be paid by the vendors' present. I did not receive any further communications from these vendors. March 1, 1995 I mailed the second letter to the vendors and explained that if I did not receive a reply by March 30, 1995, I would assume that they were not interested in attending. Shortly thereafter, I received answers from two vendors: (1) Ruth Designs from West Virginia and (2) The Sign Man from Missouri. After I informed them of their acceptance, I received check from each of these vendors for \$350.00 of which I turned over to the Grand Secretary.

In the interim period Mr. Chiles met with me and made necessary arrangements for the remainder of the committees and by Grand Chapter time everything fell into place.

The management and staff of the Sheraton Hotel and Conference Center gave me one hundred percent support and everything that I requested was provided cheerfully and without hesitation. I extend my most heartfelt thanks to: Mr. David Bressler, Mr. Richard Secord, Mr. John Chiles and members of the Hotel Staff.

I am sure that if the membership decided to return to this hotel again next year, we will receive the same cooperation and hospitality.

REPORT OF THE "OPRY WEEKEND"

Worthy Grand Matron, Worthy Grand Patron, Sisters and Brothers:

Thank you, Worthy Grand Matron and Worthy Grand Patron, for the confidence you placed in me by appointing me Chairman of the "Opry Weekend" at the beach fund raiser.

This task was both a challenge and rewarding experience. Even with the difficulty some had in attending a matinee performance, 693 tickets were sold. Our contract with the Gilmore Productions was to sell 985 tickets @ \$14.00 each. \$10.00 of this amount to go to Gilmore Productions and \$4.00 to the Order of the Eastern Star. On December 9, 1994, just prior to the show, I met with Mr. French and explained our position and problems incurred in selling the tickets. As a result of this discussion we agreed that he would void our contract and take the amount we had sold, then donate \$1,000.00 to the Eastern Star.

The 693 tickets sold included tickets bought by the various chapters in response to a letter I sent to all the District Deputies asking that they ask each chapter in their District to buy one or two tickets (or as many as they could afford), to donate to either the Residents of our Home or to some who would not be able to afford to go otherwise.

The response to this request was most rewarding. Sisters and Brothers, this is what Eastern Star is all about. Whenever a need is expressed you hear the cry and respond. Thank you from the bottom of my heart and for hearing my plea and responding.

Fifty-eight chapters out of the 21 Districts bought tickets and donated them. Of these tickets 77 were given to me to distribute. Six residents of the Eastern Star Home, the Matron, her husband (who went to help the male resident) and 6 employees attended the Opry. Sixty-three tickets were given to the less fortunate and they were very appreciative.

One hundred seventy-nine persons ate from the buffet at the Chanel Marker Restaurant, at \$2.00 per person; this netted us \$358.00. Cash donations \$146.28. Interest on checking account \$16.09. Commission from tickets to the Alabama Theatre for the Virginia Delegation \$168.00. This amount was donated to the Eastern Star by the Myrtle Shores Motel.

Printing of the tickets \$45.15.

Check for \$1,590.22 was sent to the Grand Secretary on January 31, 1995. \$25.00 donation was sent directly to the Grand Secretary. Donation of \$28.00 received and sent to the Grand Secretary on February 6, 1995. Total profit \$1,643.22.

I can not conclude this report without expressing my sincere appreciation to all who bought and sold tickets. To this Grand Body, it is always a pleasure to serve.

As some of you may have known my grandsons were to assist Sister Dot's lovely little granddaughter Summer at the Bible Ceremony but due to unforeseen circumstances they couldn't make it. I didn't think I was going to have family other than Carolyn with me tonight, but we came down to the lobby on our way to our ceremony this evening and there was our daughter from California, Sister Judy Stobby. When observing the fast paced world of today, it seems that we are constantly in search of that which is newer, brighter, faster and more sophisticated. We need to remember our obligation to each other and as our ritual reminds us—to live our lives by the Golden Rule: "Whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them."

Is there a future for our Grand Chapter? There is if we honestly believe there is and are willing to work together in peace and harmony and purpose to achieve our goals. If not, the future would seem to be bleak. The demise of our Grand Chapter would mean that one more light has been extinguished in a steadily darkening world.

And so I ask each of you tonight to join with me in a new journey to rededicate our lives and efforts to the preservation of our Order and to those principles exemplified in the lives of the heroines of our Order. Let us not fail for lack of trying. In so doing, when we do reach that city not made with hands, eternal in the heavens, our Lord will be able to say: "Well done, thy good and faithful servant."

Our Vivian was a true Southern Belle. She was a gentle, gracious lady, delightfully open with a generous spirit. She was fiercely loyal, spontaneous with her thoughts, and her love knew no bounds. She cherished her friends. Vivian's charisma endeared her to all who knew her. With quiet dignity, she expressed her convictions of truth and right. Vivian was an extraordinary lady, and most of all, a joyous Christian.

I would be true, for there are those who trust me . . .

Vivian was the daughter of the late Willy and Mamie Stokes White, and shared her family life with her sister, now Mrs. E.B. Houseal. Very early in her adult years, she met and married Louis A. Turnage. From this union there were three sons, Robert, Louis, and Richard. Their lives were blessed with eight grandchildren and nine great-grandchildren.

Vivian's life was closely linked with her loyal service to God within the First Presbyterian Church of Hartsville. Today, we look on our beloved Order with renewed reverence and love."

It is with deep sorrow that we pay tribute to a Great Lady who was loved and respected by all who knew her.

The Book of Life for Sister Flossie Chick Miller, Past Grand Matron, was quietly closed on June 12, 1994 in Union, South Carolina, where she had lived for many years.

Sister Flossie was born in Greer, South Carolina, April 14, 1909, a daughter of the late Reverend James B. and Irene Plummer Chick, and had three brothers that preceded her in death. Reverend Chick was a Methodist Minister and served many churches in the upper South Carolina Conference. She is survived by a nephew, Warren Chick.

Sister Flossie graduated from Greer High School, an honor student, and in the fall of 1926 she entered Lander College in Greenwood, South Carolina. She taught school 44 years in several communities in South Carolina.

Her life of service took many forms in her community. She was very active in the Green Street Methodist Church as a Sunday School Teacher, member of the Choir, President and member of the Young People's Group and Service Guild. She was a Past President of the Good Neighbors' Garden Club and served as District Director of the East Piedmont Garden Club.

She advanced to the office of Worthy Grand Matron in 1949.

She married the late Joel A. Miller, June 25, 1948 and he was also an active member of the Eastern Star.

Sister Flossie's Grand Chapter Session in 1950 was called "Session of Harmony" and because her life was so beautiful we know that her future will continue to be harmonious.
